Discussion at the most recent Ward One Residents Association revealed that the proposed six-story hotel on Dock Street risks the landmark status of Colonial Annapolis National Landmark Historic District. I echo that concern. You will see in the following email that Grant DeHart has been asked whether he has a suggestion to add to the National Trust for Historic Preservation's list of America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places. Grant DeHart is Maryland's Advisor to the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

If you believe as I do, I ask that by April 2 you email Grant DeHart, with copy to Robert Clark, at the following email addresses expressing your concern. Many endangered historic sites have been saved by placing them on the list of America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places. Nominations for inclusion on the list is due April 13. On April 2, Grant will be meeting with representatives of Historic Annapolis to solicit their views on whether to nominate the Colonial Annapolis National Landmark Historic District.

Note that the request is to have your support by Monday, April 2nd.

Dear Advisors,

Since 1988, the National Trust has used its list of America's 11 Most Endangered Historic Places to raise awareness about the threats facing some of the nation's greatest treasures. The list, which has identified more than 270 sites to date, has been so successful in galvanizing preservation efforts that fewer than five percent of sites have been lost. When evaluating a potential site for inclusion on the list, the National Trust considers a range of factors, including its significance, whether there is a local group engaged in its preservation, the urgency of the threat the site faces, and potential solutions to that threat.

Over the 30-year history of the 11 Most program, the National Trust has used a variety of methods and strategies for soliciting nominations for the list. One thing that has not changed, however, is our reliance on a network of Partner organizations and Advisors to provide advice and guidance on potential 11 Most

sites in their local areas. Our Partners and Advisors throughout the country have a unique understanding of threatened sites in their area, as well as an understanding of the 11 Most program and the type of sites that would benefit from the media attention of being named to the list. **The National Trust will not be doing a public call for nominations this year**, and instead will be working through these preservation networks to identify potential sites for the 11 Most Endangered list.

If you have a suggestion for the 11 Most list, please email 11Most@savingplaces.org. If the site meets our criteria, National Trust staff will contact you to discuss further and share the nomination form. Nominations will be due by **Friday, April 13** at 11:59pm EST. The national 11 Most announcement will be in late June. Please do not distribute this information widely – contact staff directly using the email above with any ideas for 11 Most sites.
